you what the
accumulated**

**mileage of
track was up
to a given
year. There
is a separate
page for
each railroad**

**as it was
originally
built with a
map of its
location and
a link to see
it displayed**

**in Google™
Maps. Please
allow
Google™
Maps time
after the map
is completed**

**to process
the XML
code
necessary to
plot the
railroad line.
It will show**

**up as a red
line. If the
railroad is in
a state
whose name
is near the
end of the**

**alphabet
(Pennsylvania
a or later), it
will take
longer to
draw the line.
Once it is**

**drawn, you
can change
zoom and
map style
without
waiting for a
redraw.**

**In order to
give some
context to
what the
United States
was like from**

**1830 to 1850,
the
population
data for
states,
counties and
towns is**

**given for the
censuses of
1830, 1840
and 1850 and
the towns for
which there
is 1850**

**census data
are shown on
the detailed
railroad
maps.**

**Remember
that there**

**were no
states with
railroads
west of the
Mississippi
River. Also
West Virginia**

**was still part
of Virginia as
this was
prior to the
Civil War.**
